

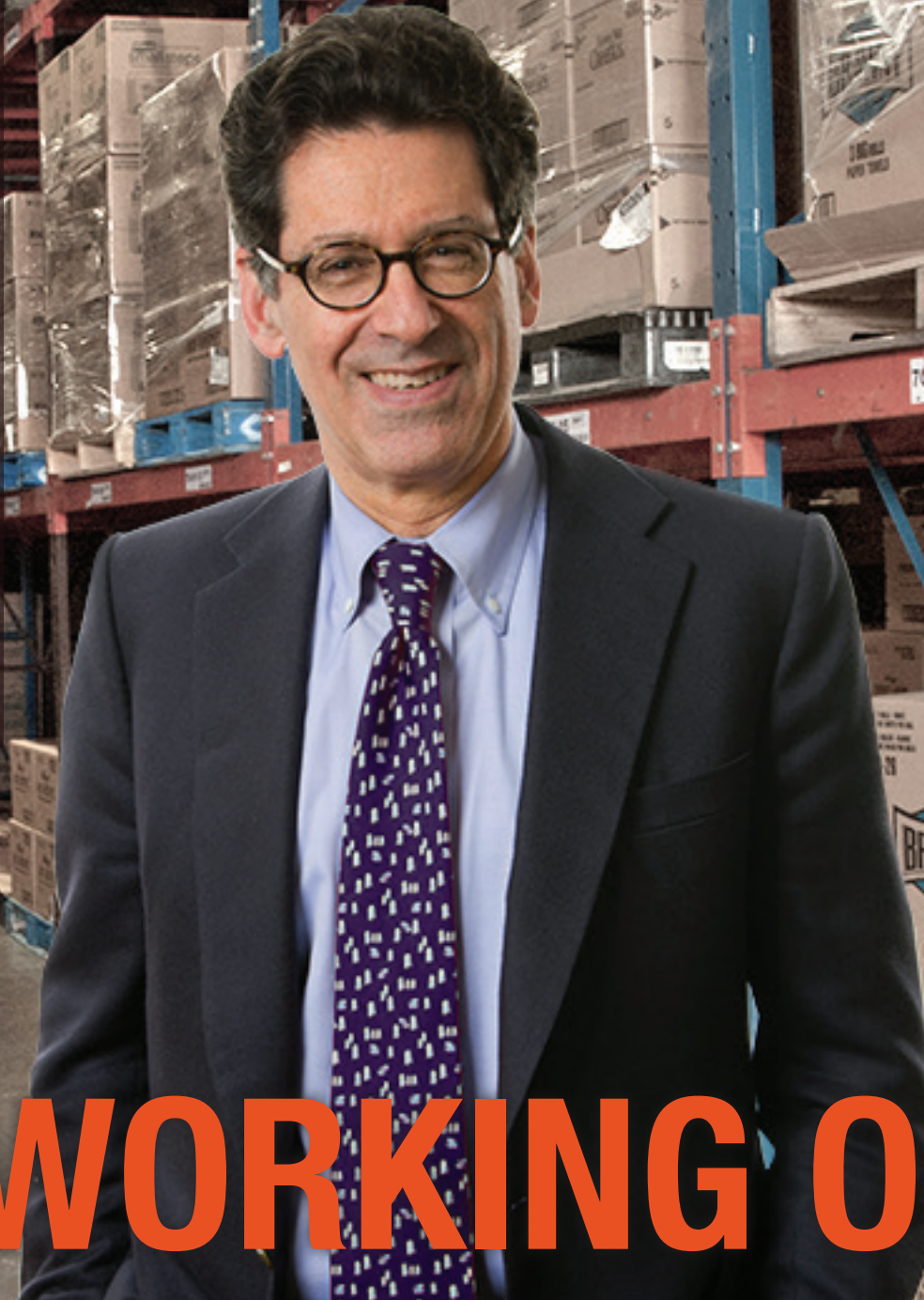

C&S Wholesale Grocers, Inc., based in Keene, NH, is the largest wholesale grocery supply company in the U.S. and the industry leader in supply chain innovation. Founded in 1918 as a supplier to independent grocery stores, C&S now services customers

of all sizes, supplying more than 6,000 independent supermarkets, chain stores, military bases, and institutions with over 150,000 different products.



IMPRESSIVE GROWTH IN 2014

In 2014, C&S made three strategic acquisitions that will allow us to grow our markets by expanding our services into new regions.

In (month), C&S acquired **Greenbax Enterprises**, the parent company of regional supermarket chain, Piggly Wiggly. One of the South's iconic brands, Piggly Wiggly has been serving customers for 99 years. The acquisition by C&S means that many Piggly Wiggly stores will continue to be operated by local entrepreneurs, serving the unique needs of their local communities.

In (month), C&S purchased **Associated Wholesalers, Inc.** (AWI), a regional cooperative food distributor based in Robeson, PA, which operates two distribution centers in Pennsylvania and New Jersey, and also provides retail services to its customers and members.

Lastly, in (month), we also acquired the warehouse and grocery supply business of **The Grocers Supply Company**. Founded over 100 years ago, The Grocers Supply Company serves regional and independent stores in the Southwest, and is among the largest U.S. grocers serving Hispanic supermarkets.

This program encourages associates to get involved in volunteer service. For each hour an associate volunteers, C&S makes a financial contribution to the community organizations where they volunteer. In 2014, C&S made Dollars for Doers awards in recognition of associates who are volunteer fire fighters, scout troop leaders, and unpaid helpers at nonprofit groups of many kinds.

Our “Team Up and Make Strides” program supports associates who join with each other to participate in walkathons, bike rides, and road races to raise awareness and money for charities like the American Cancer Society, the Alzheimer’s Association and local schools and nonprofits.



Nonprofit organizations are powerful forces for good in our communities. The new C&S Service Sabbatical is a program that will select two employees for up to four weeks of paid leave per year. During that large block of time, they’ll be in a position to make a big difference as volunteers.

Meet our C&S Volunteer of the Year

In April of 2014, C&S honored Cheryl Meehan with its Volunteer of the Year Award. A C&S associate for more than 12 years, Cheryl is a senior systems administrator on the Information Technology team at the company’s headquarters in New Hampshire. For the past several years, she has been a

volunteer at the Monadnock Center for Violence Prevention, answering calls on the center’s emergency hotline.

“I volunteer because I know I can make an impact on the lives of men, women, children, or seniors experiencing trauma or abuse,” says Cheryl. “When the phone rings—sometimes during the middle of the night—my role is to listen and try to provide callers with the information they need to find support. In some cases I share information about

services available. Other times we develop a safety plan for the caller—to go to the hospital, to the police, or an emergency shelter.”

Cheryl is passionate about her volunteer work and is deeply committed. Over a twelve month period, she volunteered 457 hours, including fifty hours of training. She’s helped hundreds of domestic abuse victims find comfort, safety, shelter, and healing. C&S is proud to honor her as our 2014 Volunteer of the Year.

NATIONAL VOLUNTEER WEEK

We celebrated National Volunteer Week 2014 at our corporate headquarters with 'Books on Wheels' — a day-long event that saw hundreds of associates unload an 18-wheeler full of new books (23,400 to be exact), and then organize and pack them for more than 30 local schools.

First Book is America's leading child literacy organization, providing new books and educational resources to children from low-income families and to schools in struggling neighborhoods. Since 2006, C&S has partnered with First Book on initiatives to ensure that children in need can experience the joy (and the developmental benefits) of reading.

In May 2014, 50 of our associates volunteered at the Mauka Lani Elementary School in Kapolei, Hawaii to read aloud to second graders and to give new books to every student in the school.

FEEDING AMERICA

Feed. Lead. Strengthen. That's how Feeding America focuses the work of its network of 200 food banks across the country that help struggling families and individuals.

In 2014, our support for Feeding America was in the form of food (the equivalent of more than 11 million meals) and grants specific to child hunger initiatives.

At the national level, C&S contributed toward training for staff at 17 food banks to increase their effectiveness in reaching more children in need. To raise awareness about the issue, we funded a series of eight videos

to tell the stories of children and families deemed "at-risk." And, we contributed to the distribution of Feeding America's "Earn Your Wings" public service announcement that has aired on television more than 200,000 times, on the radio more than one million times, on YouTube with more than 74,000 views and has been included on more than 6,000 highway billboards from coast-to-coast.

C&S is a proud Mission Partner of Feeding America and is among the top 12 food donors nationwide.



WE'VE GOT THEIR BACKS.

One in five American children do not have access to healthy food on a regular basis. The National School Lunch Program helps Monday through Friday, but what happens on weekends and holidays when school cafeterias are closed? Funding from C&S invests in Feeding America's BackPack Program to provide elementary school age students (and sometimes their brothers and sisters) with easy-to-prepare food for weekends and during school vacation.

SHARE OUR STRENGTH

Share Our Strength is dedicated to making sure no kid in the U.S. grows up experiencing hunger. In 2014, C&S provided funding for the organization's work in seven states (Maryland, Louisiana, Florida, New Hampshire, Vermont, Indiana and Pennsylvania) plus the District of Columbia to increase participation and access to school breakfast programs, SNAP, after school and summer meals programs, and the "Cooking Matters" nutrition education program.

We also helped Share Our Strength produce videos for the No Kid Hungry Family project on their website, and, to have visibility at important national conferences where the problem of hunger—and solutions—were discussed.

CONGRESSIONAL HUNGER CENTER

Fighting hunger takes tenacity, an understanding of the complexities, and new ideas. The Congressional Hunger Center is a leadership training organization dedicated to the development of the next generation of hunger activists. Since 2005, C&S has supported the Center's Emerson Hunger Fellowship, a year-long program in the U.S.

David Blount is one of 16 members of the 2014-15 class of Emerson Hunger Fellows. Like his classmates, he will spend six months working with policy makers in Washington D.C. on hunger-related issues, and the other six months on a field assignment. His project is in Pennsylvania where he will assess the impact of eliminating the traditional school meal application process in high poverty districts. David holds degrees in sociology and international studies from Loyola University in Chicago.



C&S DELIVERS A BOUNTY IN NOVEMBER

Holidays are cherished opportunities for American families to reunite and bond with each other over a wonderful meal. Each year, C&S helps families in need enjoy a memorable feast, with our annual Thanksgiving turkey donations. In 2014, we donated more than 7,000 birds to local food banks for distribution to families in need.



WORKING FOR STRONG COMMUNITIES AND HEALTHY CHILDREN

C&S associates are more than employees; we're also dads, moms, uncles, aunts, friends, and volunteers. And at each C&S location, our associates are working to build stronger, healthier communities through donations, volunteer service, and a company-supported campaign for the United Way.



EMPOWERING KIDS

In 2014, C&S funded the Edge of Leadership program for elementary and middle school students in Vermont and New Hampshire. This program, an initiative of High Five Adventure Learning Center, challenges kids with outdoor adventures that help them connect and communicate in positive and empowering ways.



HELPING KIDS BE KIDS

The Hole in the Wall Gang Camp is one of six organizations supported by the annual C&S Charity Golf Outing. The camp welcomes children who are battling cancer or other serious illnesses, and offers them unforgettable, fun experiences.

FIGHTING CHILDHOOD CANCER AND HUNGER

Childhood should be a time of joy, growth, and wonder. But for the 12,000 U.S. children who are battling cancer, and the 12 million children who are living with hunger, joy can sometimes be in short supply.

Our annual "Tee Up for Kids" golf tournament, run by C&S Charities, raises money to help children with cancer and children at risk of hunger. In 2014, our golfers made possible a record donation amount—\$1.65 million—which was given to six organizations.

Children's Hospital at Dartmouth: \$450,000 for care and treatment of children in the pediatric oncology unit

The Jimmy Fund/Dana-Farber Cancer Institute: \$200,000 for pediatric cancer research

The Hole in the Wall Gang Camp: \$125,000 for camperships for children with cancer

Feeding America: \$425,000 for the national Back Pack Program and child hunger initiatives

Share Our Strength: \$400,000 for the No Kid Hungry campaign

The Community Kitchen of Keene, NH: \$50,000 to help expand food distributions to families

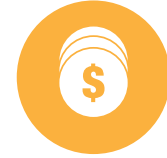

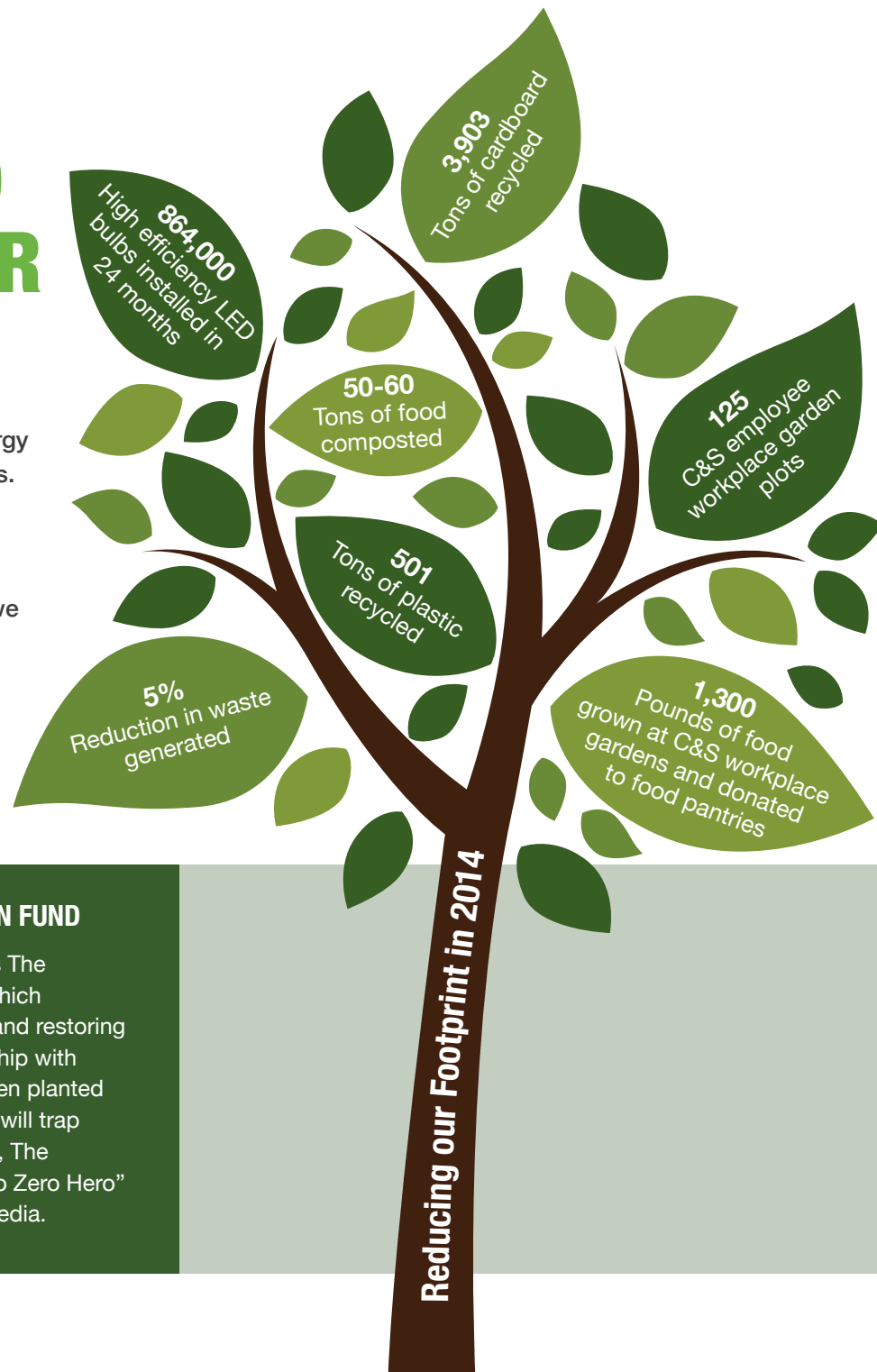

WORKING TO PROTECT OUR PLANET

At C&S, we work to improve our performance in key areas such as energy conservation and sustainable practices. Thanks to waste reduction, recycling, and energy efficiency upgrades at our distribution centers—and significant investments in logistics technology—we continue to do our part to protect and preserve the health of the planet.



C&S HONORED BY THE CONSERVATION FUND

C&S Wholesale Grocers proudly supports The Conservation Fund’s Go Zero program, which addresses climate change by protecting and restoring American forests. Since 2007, in partnership with Go Zero, more than 57,000 trees have been planted across 190 acres; as they grow, the trees will trap an estimated 68,550 tons of CO₂. In 2014, The Conservation Fund designated C&S a “Go Zero Hero” and highlighted the company on social media.



CATCHING FIRE: Helping Veterans and Saving Forests

Returning to civilian life can be difficult for some military veterans. But the Student Conservation Association offers a way to ease the transition. Their Veterans Fire Corp trains veterans to tackle fires in wilderness areas, and prepares them for new careers in firefighting, disaster response, or forestry. In 2014, C&S began supporting the SCA’s Veterans Fire Corp program with a grant and a donation for food for the crew during their extensive fire line training.

DISASTER RESPONSE

CALIFORNIA

Napa Earthquake/Wildfires

A major earthquake in August, and a record number of destructive wildfires made 2014 a tough year for California, causing well over \$1 billion dollars in damage to cities and towns, roads and bridges, homes and farms. C&S assisted the American Red Cross relief efforts with a donation of water for thousands of families who were left without housing, water, or electricity.

HAWAII

Hurricane Iselle

Hurricane Iselle was the strongest tropical storm in recorded history to make landfall in Hawaii, causing widespread damage and power outages. C&S partnered with the American Red Cross to donate water for first responders and people in emergency shelters.

INDIA

Andhra Pradesh Cyclone

In October, Cyclone Hudhud raged through the Indian state of Andhra Pradesh, home to some of our C&S colleagues and their families. The cyclone triggered massive evacuations and caused severe damage to homes, businesses and the infrastructure of the area. A C&S financial contribution will help to rebuild the community.

400,000 new books for kids in Liberia

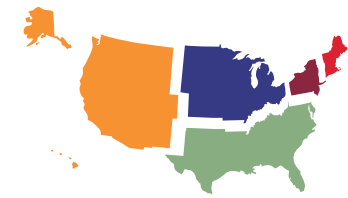

A month of food for 600 people in Ebola zones. Food (rice, peas/beans/lentils, vegetable oil, iodized salt and “super cereal” delivered to patients in treatment centers and in communities with widespread infection.

FOOD BANK OF CONTRA COSTA

Hunger is a serious problem in the Sacramento area of California, where over 24% of children cope with hunger or food insecurity. The River City Food Bank's BackSnack program serves five different schools, each in a way that fits its students' needs, from on-site breakfasts, to take-home food bags, to nutrition and cooking classes. In 2014, C&S provided grants to purchase a van to support the BackSnack program and to support Sacramento's Food for Kids program, a monthly distribution of nonperishable items and fresh produce to students in four low-income schools.



WALDO HOLT SAN JOAQUIN CONSERVANCY

The mission of the Waldo Holt San Joaquin Conservancy is to preserve critical wildlife habitat through the purchase and protection of land. Over 90% of Central California watercourse and wetlands habitats have been lost to development since the early 20th century. A grant from C&S will help the Conservancy continue to ensure that native plant species, wildlife, and migrating birds will find refuge.



WARRIOR TRANSITION BATTALION

Soldiers transitioning from active combat to civilian life often face daunting physical and mental challenges. The Warrior Transition Battalion provides services so that men and women can heal, recover, and prepare for a new future. C&S helped members of the Warrior Transition Battalion in Kapolei, Hawaii enjoy a traditional holiday meal and provided items for food baskets to soldiers and their families.
